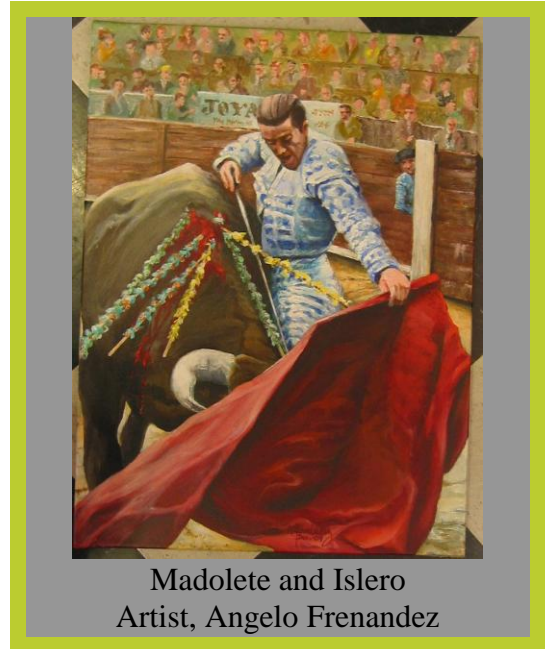
Fine Art Painter
