# ART PROWL IN COOKEVILLE GOES GREEN

## ART Prowl Goes Green

Artists have always used found, scrap, and otherwise discarded materials to transform their vision, message or experiences into unique and valuable works of art. During the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual ART Prowl, scheduled for November 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>, visitors will find several artists who work primarily with recycled materials.

Wood and fibers artist Karen Norris is featuring her new series of handmade art-dolls constructed of 100% recycled content. "I call myself Mrs. Recycle," said Norris. "I love double knits from the 70s to make the bodies, they have great pattern and texture."

Stiv Mackey creates sculptural metalwork from found scrap metal, aluminum cans, and anything metal his family saves for him. "I made my first bicycle out of three 'trashed' bicycles," laughed Mackey. "There is no such thing as junk metal."

This year's ART Prowl will feature a special exhibition, *RE-CREATE: Art from Recycled Materials*. "We are thrilled to add this special exhibition to the ART Prowl's 10th anniversary roster," said Marilee Hall, renowned ceramic artist and Director of the ART Prowl. "It's essential that we create awareness of environmentally-conscious choices in our daily lives, and collecting "green art" is just one way to recognize and celebrate our responsibility to this beautiful planet."

ART Prowl's studio/gallery tour and art sale takes place on the square in Cookeville and throughout the historic West Side, a popular and growing arts and dining district.

October 28- Beading Class Workshop with Linda Farber on the Kumihimo Japanese Braiding Technique- 10:00 am - 2:00pm -\$30 for members and \$35 for non-members - Cost of kit fee is \$30.

On October 28 from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm, instructor, Linda Farber, will present a class on the ancient art of Japanese Cord Braiding. Braiding is a form of meditation as well as an elegant and beautiful craft.

Kumihimo is thousands of years old and it means the "gathering of threads". The technique is done on a braiding loom and can be worked with cord alone or with added beads, creating beautiful and varied braids for jewelry, clothing, hair ornaments, bookmarks, or a myriad of other uses. Students will learn both techniques but will concentrate on beaded braids, leaving the class with a beaded bracelet that closely resembles beaded crochet. A sample of this bracelet is on display at the Plateau Creative Arts Center, 451 Lakeview Drive (off Peavine), Fairfield Glade. This is a simple art form that provides fast results.
